A. PROGRESS TOWARD GOALS, OBJECTIVES, MILESTONES

Initiative 1. Comprehensive Vocational and Educational and Rehabilitative Training Programs

Goal: Provide training for up to 100 by the end of 2000

Including: 4 Internships

3 Job Placements (resulting from internships)

7 College Scholarships

Milestone:

- ◆ Training Programs – See Below
- ◆ 10 Yukon Delta residents graduated from courses at AVTEC this quarter
- ◆ 12 college students were enrolled during this quarter
 - 2 students graduated from Sheldon Jackson College with teaching degrees
 - 7 students are attending the University of Alaska
 - 2 students are attending the Alaska Pacific University
 - 1 student is enrolled in APU's RANA Program
- ◆ The balance in Yukon Delta's scholarship fund at the University of Alaska after funding the current semester is approximately \$244,557
- ◆ The balance in Yukon Delta's scholarship fund at Sheldon Jackson College after funding the current semester is approximately \$106,019
- ◆ The balance in Yukon Delta's scholarship fund at Alaska Pacific University after funding the current semester is approximately \$200,464
- ◆ The balance in Yukon Delta's education fund is \$163,000
- ◆ 1 Internship

Objectives:

- ◆ Assure that an appropriately skilled native work force is available for all opportunities created in CDQ enterprises.
- ◆ Provide technical knowledge to native work force to assure that skills are developed to move into higher paying senior positions.

TRAINING PROGRAM 1: Heavy Equipment

One student graduated from the Heavy Equipment course at AVTEC this quarter.

TRAINING PROGRAM 2: Business and Office Technology

Eight students graduated from the Business and Office Technology course at AVTEC this quarter.

TRAINING PROGRAM 3: Diesel Engine Technology

One student graduated from the Diesel Engine Technology course at AVTEC this quarter.

TRAINING PROGRAM 4: Office Interns

One resident was employed as a maintenance/welding intern during this quarter at Icicle Seafoods' Everett plant.

TRAINING PROGRAM 5: Advanced Welding

Four residents have been participating in an advanced welding program building 22' – 26' aluminum skiffs in Seward. The finished skiffs are available for sale to Yukon Delta residents. This project has been on a trial basis in Seward. If successful, the skiff building project will be continued in one of our villages. Seventeen finished skiffs were shipped to Alakanuk and are available for sale to village residents.

TRAINING PROGRAM 6: Fishing and Seamanship

One resident was aboard Golden Alaska's catcher vessel the F/V Ocean Leader during this quarter as a first time trainee. One resident was aboard Golden Alaska's catcher vessel the F/V American Beauty during this quarter as a first time trainee. One resident was aboard the F/V Lisa Marie during this quarter as a first time trainee.

TRAINING PROGRAM 7: Junior Achievement

The Junior Achievement program, funded by YDFDA, is a pilot project being offered in the communities of Emmonak and Alakanuk. This program is a learning tool for the juniors and seniors to gain knowledge and understanding about the jobs involved with the fishing industry in the Bering Sea. Classes were taught by the village representatives with assistance from the training and employment coordinator and teachers. Classes are one hour per week. This program offers students an opportunity to secure jobs with YDFDA's fishing partners. The students were very interested in this program and gained knowledge in the programs offered by YDFDA. Other villages will be added when this program resumes in the fall.

Scholarship Program:

Twelve students were enrolled during the second quarter. Two students were enrolled at Sheldon Jackson College. They finished their student teaching program and graduated in May 2000. Seven students are enrolled at the University of Alaska. Two students are enrolled at the Alaska Pacific University and one student is enrolled in APU's RANA Program.

At its meeting June 9, 2000, YDFDA's Board of Directors selected a Scholarship Committee to review and update the guidelines for the Yukon Delta Education Fund. This scholarship fund is for students who wish to continue their education outside the State of Alaska in areas of study not available within the state and at institutions within the state where the fishery tax credits may not be used.

Initiative 2. Placement of YDFDA Community Residents in Bering Sea Harvesting & Processing, Factory Trawlers

Goal: Train 169 individuals by the end of 2000

Milestone:

- ◆ 5 Yukon Delta residents were first time trainees during this quarter
- ◆ 6 Yukon Delta residents were re-hired during in this quarter

Objective:

- ◆ Provide on-the-job training and experience in offshore and onshore fisheries and generate employment and income-earning opportunities to community residents.

Golden Alaska Seafoods, Inc.

Three residents were aboard the M/V Golden Alaska for the Hake Season. Two were returning crew, one was a new hire.

Golden Alaska Catcher Boats

Two residents were aboard the Golden Alaska catcher boats fishing for Hake. One was returning crew on the F/V Ocean Leader and one was a new hire on the F/V American Beauty.

Lisa Marie

Four residents were aboard the F/V Lisa Marie fishing for Opilio Crab. One was a first time trainee, three were returning crew.

Icicle Seafoods

Two residents were aboard Icicle Seafoods' processor the Arctic Star, Both were new hires.

Initiative 3. Salmon and Herring Permit Buy-Back and IFQ Acquisition Program

Goal: Provide up to \$100,000 for salmon or herring permits and up to \$100,000 for IFQ Purchases

Milestone:

- ◆ IFQ purchases – YDFDA is examining the purchase of A shares for Sablefish and Halibut IFQ for fisheries appropriate to the F/V Lisa Marie.
- ◆ Due to the fact that ADF&G is again predicting a poor Yukon salmon season for 2000, YDFDA is not actively promoting nor encouraging new salmon

permit loan applicants. The Norton Sound herring fishery has also been predicted to have very low prices for the upcoming year and therefore we do not encourage anyone to pursue the purchase of one of these permits at this time.

- ◆ YDFDA continues to work with the Division of Investments to execute modification agreements to refinance and delay payments for several loans in arrears due to the poor fishing. At this time no loan packages through the Division of Investments or AVCP are in default.
- ◆ The skiff building program continued in Seward. Four Yukon Delta residents received advanced welding training building skiffs for sale to residents of the Yukon Delta region. Skiffs are being advertised for sale in all communities of the lower Yukon as part of our outreach program. Loans will be financed through the Division of Investments or AVCP. YDFDA will guarantee 40% of loans through the Division of Investments for YDFDA built skiffs and YDFDA built skiff/motor packages. Loan applications have been sent to the village representatives for potential applicants. At this time the shop in Seward is being closed in hopes of moving this operation to Alakanuk.

Objectives:

- ◆ Maximize local benefits realized from our traditional salmon fishery and expansion to other local fisheries.

Initiative 4. Training Subsidy for Small-Multi Fishery Boats

Goal: Provide employment opportunities for communities and community residents.

Teach fishing techniques and provide boats for a community-owned fishing company.

Provide direct income from the groundfish resource.

Create opportunities for local residents to operate and own boats.

Milestone:

- ◆ Finalized the sale of the F/V Blue Dolphin.
- ◆ Finalized the sale of two 32' vessels. Yukon Delta is shifting its emphasis away from the fleet of small vessels and is presently analyzing possible joint ventures in larger vessels under Initiative VI.
- ◆ \$4,482 was used as a match for two crewmembers aboard catcher vessels.

Objective:

- ◆ Develop a fleet of locally owned and operated fishing vessels.

Initiative 5. Continued Development of Shoreside Processing Operations

Goal: Establish self-sufficient, multi-product, value-added shoreside processing facilities.

Maximize the employment and payroll benefits derived by the communities from our seafood harvest.

Milestone:

- ◆ YDFDA continued funding the Kotlik Fisheries Cooperative, Inc. Kotlik Fisheries Cooperative has signed a salmon tendering contract with the Yukon Delta Fish Marketing Co-op of Emmonak for the 2000 salmon season.
- ◆ YDFDA provided Kotlik Fisheries Cooperative with a welding machine. The welding machine will enable them to maintain their two 28' boats as well as assist fishermen with skiff repairs as needed.
- ◆ YDFDA will provide funding for the purchase of 6 vans and 4 flats to enable Kotlik Fisheries Corp. a work area for flying fresh salmon to market for the 2001 season.
- ◆ Nunam Iqua Saltery – Tribal and City Governments of Nunam Iqua will be meeting to decide if this is a feasible project in light of recent salmon disasters.
- ◆ YDFDA's Board of Directors made a commitment to help develop markets for the Emmonak value added smoked salmon produced from the 1999 catch through a Seattle broker and marketing distributor. YDFDA is funding the design of a gift package to facilitate the sale of the VAP smoked products as a high end gift pack.
- ◆ YDFDA, in association with Yukon River Drainage Fisheries Association (YRDFA), has received approval for disaster funds to provide ice machines and support as part of a salmon quality preservation project in Marshall, Mountain Village and Kotlik and to provide insulated totes and shipping liners to Emmonak. This project is being supported with EDA Disaster Funding. YDFDA is in the process of submitting the funding budget to the EDA.

Objective:

- ◆ Value add seafood products and explore for commercial quantities of fish locally to employ local residents.

Initiative 6. YDFDA Investments in Offshore Vessels

Goal: Joint ventures to purchase and jointly operate catcher and catcher/processor vessels in both open access and CDQ fisheries for all fisheries.

Milestone:

Analysis continues on several projects:

- ◆ Two 32' vessels were sold this quarter leaving YDFI with one vessel, a 32' bow picker. Funds from the sale of the 32' vessels have been set aside for use in funding other future joint ventures
- ◆ YDFDA is in the process of finalizing an agreement with Golden Alaska Seafoods for investment in the Golden Alaska mothership and two catcher vessels. This agreement will be effective July 1, 2000.
- ◆ YDFDA is actively pursuing an investment in a Longline catcher/processor. Analysis of this project is continuing and three potential partners are submitting proposals for YDFDA to consider.
- ◆ Investment in a crab catcher vessel. This project has been delayed until later this year due to the adverse impact of the reduction in crab GHL in the Bering Sea. Several possible investments are being taken into consideration.
- ◆ Provided Yukon Delta residents with fishing positions aboard the F/V Lisa Marie and two Golden Alaska catcher vessels fishing both CDQ and open access.

Objective:

- ◆ To own and operate YDFDA's own fleet of vessels to prosecute the fisheries in the North Pacific.
- ◆ Establish a fleet of combination catcher and catcher/processor vessels to fish open access as well as CDQ fisheries in the Bering Sea.
- ◆ Maximize the employment and payroll benefits derived by local fishermen from open access and CDQ harvests.
- ◆ Protect YDFDA's equity.

Initiative 7. Financing Program to Support Development of Small Business Fisheries Infrastructure

Goal: To develop local marine service facilities and fisheries business infrastructure to support the fishing industry.

Milestone:

- ◆ YDFDA, LYEDC (Ardor) and Kuigpagmiut Corporation (representing Mountain Village and St. Mary's) have submitted an application for funding to the U.S. Department of Commerce to develop regional training facilities in St. Mary's for the benefit of residents of the entire area. Several regional meetings have taken place in St. Mary's during the quarter with regional and federal representatives. This project has now been accepted as one of the projects for

final study for possible funding. The EDA team has toured the vacant facilities and is assisting with further planning. Lower Yukon School District and the St. Mary's School District are also being included in the development of this plan. LYEDC and YDFDA are looking to the City of St. Mary's and the Tribal Council of St. Mary's to take over the lead in this project and assume control of it in the near future.

- ◆ OceanLogic, LLC, - The newest version of the software is being used successfully. The preliminary version for shoreside catcher vessel deliveries is being tested at this time. The board of Directors has decided for the present time to fund no further loan requests. No requests for additional capital will be funded.
- ◆ The Welding Shop – YDFDA is actively seeking bids to estimate the cost of a joint facility in one of the villages. Villagers, under Initiative I, are still building skiffs. The facility being leased in Seward has been closed and arrangements are being made to construct twelve skiffs in Alakanuk during the Winter of 2000-2001.

Objective:

- ◆ Fund loans to develop fisheries business support sector.
- ◆ To service the developing local and offshore fishing sector.

B. OUTREACH

We have continued our village representative program in our six villages, Alakanuk, Emmonak, Grayling, Kotlik, Mountain Village and Nunam Iqua. The village representatives work in the community to provide information regarding employment opportunities and training positions and administer drug tests to applicants. They also have applications and information on the scholarship programs and loan applications from both the Division of Investments and the AVCP Revolving Loan Program.

YDFDA's newsletter, the "Yukon Drifter", is being published quarterly. It is mailed to every household in member communities.

The training and employment coordinator is located at our Emmonak office. His duties include finding and filling inshore/offshore training and employment opportunities as well as training and educational opportunities at AVTEC, Alaska Pacific University, Sheldon Jackson College, and all branches of the University of Alaska. This person administers YDFDA's scholarship programs and YDFDA's permit and gear loan programs through the Division of Investments and the AVCP Revolving Loan Programs. YDFDA feels it is important to administer these programs from the villages so residents have easy access to the programs they are most interested in.

Junior Achievement, presented in Alakanuk and Emmonak, was well received by the junior and senior students. This program will continue next fall in different communities.

We are working with the community of Marshall a, non-CDQ member village, to provide an ice machine under our Salmon Quality Preservation Project using EDA Disaster Funding. Approval for this project has recently been received.

Additionally YDFDA continues to work with other communities of the Yukon who are not members of CDQ communities by our continuing financial support of the Lower Yukon Economic Development Corporation (ARDOR).

The attached announcements were posted in the villages during the second quarter.

ADMINISTRATION

A. Board Activities

1. New Board Members – There were no changes in Board Members during the second quarter of 2000.
2. The Board of Directors met April 26 and 27, 2000 in Alakanuk, AK and June 9, 2000 in Seattle, WA.

Substantial Decisions April 26 and 27, 2000:

Due diligence continues on the purchase of a percentage ownership in the Golden Alaska mothership and two catcher vessels. The Board gave approval for administration to sign the initial letter of intent.

A resolution was proposed to change the bylaws prohibiting directors to be employees of YDFDA or its subsidiaries.

Substantial Decisions June 9, 2000:

The Board passed a resolution for the purchase of a percentage ownership in the Golden Alaska mothership and two catcher vessels.

The Board instructed administration to draw up a resolution to move YDFDA's main office to Alaska.

The Board appointed a Scholarship Committee consisting of five Board members and one village resident. The Scholarship Committee has already met and determined guidelines for the Yukon Delta Education Fund. A minimum of 80% of the education funds will be placed into an endowment fund.

The Board appointed a chairman for an Investment Committee. He will select Board members to be on the committee.

The Board approved asking Lou Fleming, President of Golden Alaska Seafoods, to join the Financial Advisory Board. Lou Fleming has extensive experience in fishing vessels and will be an asset to our Financial Advisory Board.

The Board passed a resolution to guarantee 40% of loans with the Division of Investments on YDFDA built aluminum skiffs or aluminum skiff motor packages.

B. CDP Amendments 2000

Submitted technical amendment April 4, 2000 to modify Pacific Cod fish plan to extend CDQ fishing with one observer when necessary for the balance of the year 2000.

Submitted technical amendment April 8, 2000 to add the vessels Alaskan Leader and Bristol Leader to YDFDA fish plan for the year 2000.

Submitted substantial amendment on June 21, 2000 to transfer YDFDA's annual allocation of Central and Western Atka Mackerel and Pacific Ocean Perch CDQ from YDFDA to APICDA.

D. Other Fishing Issues/Activities

During this quarter we harvested cod, sablefish and turbot. No groundfish was harvested during the quarter. Our partner, Alaskan Leader, while harvesting sablefish and turbot pulled in two simultaneous sets that were greater than our quota. We have been in contact with NMFS to see what we can do about this since NMFS no longer allows any quota transfers for overages.

YDFDA is concerned that with new state regulations prohibiting vessels over 60' from fishing for Pacific cod inside state waters in the Adak area and proposed similar regulations concerning other areas of the state, to be taken up before the Board of Fish in November, that the F/V Lisa Marie may be unable to fish for cod in areas that have proven successful fishing grounds.

F/V Lisa Marie

In April the F/V Lisa Marie fished for Opilio Crab. Three residents were aboard as crew members and one resident as a trainee. In May and June the F/V Lisa Marie was in Seward for maintenance.

F/V Blue Dolphin
