### A. PROGRESS TOWARD GOALS, OBJECTIVES, MILESTONES

#### *Initiative 1. Comprehensive Vocational and Educational Training Program*

Goals: Vocational Training

Provide 15 residents with vocational training annually

Provide 1 training class to Board of Directors

Scholarship Programs

Provide 12 residents with scholarships

Internship and Apprenticeship Program

Place 6 trainees on vessels

Place 5 in internship or apprenticeship programs

Milestone:

- ◆ Fishing and Seamanship
  - 1 resident as a trainee aboard catcher vessels
  - 3 residents as trainees aboard F/V Lisa Marie
- ◆ 9 Yukon Delta residents graduated from AVTEC this quarter
- ◆ 13 college student were enrolled and received YDFDA scholarships during this quarter
  - 9 students were attending the University of Alaska
    - (1 student is also receiving a scholarship for the summer semester)
  - 1 student was enrolled in APU's RANA Program
  - 1 student was enrolled at Boise State University
  - 1 student was enrolled at DeVry Institute of Technology

Objectives:

- ◆ Provide training to residents that they can utilize to find full time employment
- ◆ Provide financial support for students working towards undergraduate or graduate studies
- ◆ Provide on the job training to qualified residents to enable them to work into higher paying jobs on vessels and in administrative positions

#### **TRAINING PROGRAM 1: Business and Office Technology**

Six students graduated from the Business and Office Technology course at AVTEC this quarter.

**TRAINING PROGRAM 2: Facilities Maintenance**

Two students graduated from the Facilities Maintenance course at AVTEC this quarter.

**TRAINING PROGRAM 3: Culinary Arts**

One resident was enrolled in the Culinary Arts course at AVTEC this quarter.

**TRAINING PROGRAM 4: Internships**

Three resident worked at internships during this quarter. One was at Peter Pan Seafoods in Seattle, one was at Icicle Seafoods' Bellingham plant and one was at Port Chatham in Everett.

**TRAINING PROGRAM 5: Fishing and Seamanship**

One resident was aboard Golden Alaska's catcher vessels the F/V Ocean Leader during this quarter as a trainee. Two residents were aboard the F/V Lisa Marie during this quarter as trainees.

**Scholarship Program:**

Under the Yukon Delta Scholarship Program:

Nine residents were enrolled at the University of Alaska

(One is also receiving a scholarship for the summer semester)

One resident was enrolled in the RANA program at the Alaska Pacific University

Under the Yukon Delta Educational Fund:

One residents was enrolled at DeVry Institute of Technology

One resident graduated from the Career Academy

One resident was enrolled at Boise State University

***Initiative 2. Comprehensive Job Placement of YDFDA Community Residents***

Goal: Place 75 residents in offshore fisheries

Place 3 residents on catcher vessels after completion of internship

Place 4 residents on the F/V Lisa Marie

Place 7 residents in jobs utilizing vocational training

Milestone:

- ◆ 12 Yukon Delta residents were first time trainees during this quarter
- ◆ 1 Yukon Delta resident continued his internship on a Golden Alaska catcher vessel
- ◆ 11 Yukon Delta residents were re-hired during this quarter
- ◆ \$220 was expended for one crewmember's training wages aboard the F/V Lisa Marie. The other two trainees were not paid in the second quarter
- ◆ \$3,312 was expended for four crewmembers training wages aboard the Golden Alaska catcher vessels

Objective:

- ◆ Provide employment opportunities for residents that would not otherwise be available

***Golden Alaska Seafoods, Inc.***

Fourteen residents were aboard the M/V Golden Alaska for Pollock CD Season in the 2nd quarter. Nine were first time trainees, five were returning crew.

***Golden Alaska Catcher Vessels***

One resident was aboard the Golden Alaska catcher vessel F/V Ocean Leader this quarter continuing an internship program.

***Lisa Marie***

Three residents were aboard the F/V Lisa Marie this quarter. One was fishing cod and two were tendering salmon. All three were first time trainees.

***Icicle Seafoods***

Two residents were aboard Icicle Seafoods' floating processors during this quarter. One was aboard the Northern Victor and one was aboard the Arctic Star. Both were returning crew.

***Premier Pacific***

Two residents were aboard the M/V Ocean Phoenix during the month of May fishing for hake. Both were returning crew. In the month of June, one resident returned for the CD season with the M/V Ocean Phoenix.

***American Seafoods***

Two residents were aboard the F/V Triumph this quarter. Both were returning crew.

***Initiative 3. Permit Buy-Back, Fishing Vessels/Outboards Loan Guarantees and IFQ Share Purchase Program***

Goal: Enable residents to purchase major equipment and/or permits needed to complete in the local fisheries.

Provide additional royalty income to YDFDA, increased fishing time and profits to vessel and increased employment to residents.

Milestone:

- ◆ IFQ purchases – YDFDA is actively seeking offers to purchase A shares for Sablefish and Halibut IFQ for fisheries appropriate to the F/V Lisa Marie and

Yukon Delta's other investment goals. YDFDA purchased approximately 26,000 pounds of halibut IFQ A shares this quarter.

- ◆ The State of Alaska has declared the Yukon River salmon season a disaster for 2000. For this reason, YDFDA is not actively promoting or encouraging new salmon permit loan applications. ADF&G has closed the Yukon River to Commercial fishing for the 2001 season
- ◆ YDFDA is continuing to work with the Division of Investments to execute modification agreements to refinance and delay payments for several loans in arrears due to the disastrous fishing. At this time two loans packages through the Division of Investments or AVCP are in default.

Objectives:

- ◆ Make available up to \$100,000 in loan guarantees for permits and vessels/outboard motors.
- ◆ Provide additional royalty income to YDFDA
- ◆ Provide increased fishing time and profits to vessels and employment to residents.

#### ***Initiative 4. Financial Support for Local Small Boat Multi-Fisheries***

Goal: Provide financial support for vessel or gear modifications to participate in Norton Sound fisheries.

Milestone:

- ◆ Provided financial support to 14 Yukon Delta fishermen participating in Norton Sound herring and crab fisheries.
- ◆ Worked with Norton Sound Economic Development Corp. to provide a market for fishery products.

Objective:

- ◆ Provide financial assistance to support private and company vessels to enable them to fish for Norton Sound herring, crab, halibut and other species.

#### ***Initiative 5. Development of Shoreside Processing Operations***

Goal: Kotlik Buying Station was to begin operating as a buying station however the State of Alaska has closed the commercial fishing season for the entire area.

Provide grant funds to assist the private sector fleet with exploratory research for commercial fisheries in proximity to the Yukon Delta

Complete planning and feasibility phase of Nunam Iqua Saltery

Milestone:

- ◆ YDFDA continued funding the Kotlik Fisheries Cooperative, Inc. In light of the recent failures of salmon runs, Kotlik is planning a village meeting with YDFDA to decide if profitable projects other than fisheries related should be considered and pursued.
- ◆ Kotlik Fisheries Cooperative, Inc. is working on preparation of a gravel pad for the ice machine and generator being provided from YDFDA and YR DFA with EDA disaster funding. It is anticipated that the ice machine and gravel pad will be ready for operation some time this fall.
- ◆ Nunam Iqua Saltery – This project is currently on hold due to the recent closure of the commercial salmon fishery and projected closure in that district for the foreseeable future.
- ◆ YDFDA, in association with Yukon River Drainage Fisheries Association (YR DFA), has received final approval for disaster funds to provide ice machines and support as part of a salmon quality preservation project in Marshall, Mountain Village and Kotlik and provide insulated totes and shipping liners to Emmonak and other villages. This project is being supported with Economic Development Administration Disaster Funding. Two hundred insulated fish totes were shipped in May. The ice machines have been purchased and are being prepared for shipment.

Objective:

- ◆ Development of local community value-added operations
- ◆ Explore for commercial quantities of fish to be harvested by local residents.

***Initiative 6. Joint Venture Investments in Offshore Catcher/Processor Vessels***

Goal: Joint ventures to purchase and jointly operate catcher and catcher/processor vessels in both open access and CDQ fisheries for all fisheries.

Create additional jobs and long-term employment opportunities

Milestone:

- ◆ YDFDA is actively pursuing an investment in a Longline catcher/processor. Analysis of this project is continuing and several potential partners have submitted proposals for YDFDA for consideration. YDFDA has identified several potential investment alternatives. YDFDA is analyzing the 2000 financial statements from these possible investments and make a final decision on which investment or investments best suit YDFDA.

- ◆ Investment in a crab catcher vessel. This project has been delayed due to the adverse impact of the reduction in crab GHL in the Bering Sea. Yukon Delta has identified a crab catcher processor that we are interested in making an investment in. An analysis is currently being done on this project.
- ◆ Provided Yukon Delta residents with fishing positions aboard the F/V Lisa Marie and Golden Alaska catcher vessels fishing both CDQ and open access.

Objective:

- ◆ To own and operate YDFDA's own fleet of vessels to prosecute the fisheries in the North Pacific.
- ◆ Establish a fleet of combination catcher and catcher/processor vessels to fish open access as well as CDQ fisheries in the Bering Sea.
- ◆ Maximize the employment and payroll benefits derived by local fishermen from open access and CDQ harvests.
- ◆ Protect YDFDA's equity.

***Initiative 7. Financial Support of Community Economic Development of Small Business Fisheries Infrastructure***

Goal: To develop local marine service facilities and fisheries business infrastructure to support the fishing industry.

Milestone:

- ◆ YDFDA, along with Calista and the State of Alaska, co-sponsored an Economic Funding and Job Summit in St. Marys'. The summit was to make villages aware of the various funding sources available for projects within the CDQ region and beyond. The Summit also brought together contractors and community government to identify sources of local personnel and identify training needs to assure a qualified local workforce.
- ◆ YDFDA continues to provide funds to leverage a State of Alaska ARDOR grant award to allow for the continued operation of the LYEDC ARDOR. LYEDC goals are to:
  1. Expand business opportunities for residents in the region
  2. Include additional communities in the Champion Community Program
  3. Ensure region residents access to a local training facility
  4. Develop an overall economic plan for the region.

These goals fall in line with YDFDA's goals and it is anticipated that YDFDA will continue to provide leveraged funding to this local ARDOR. Thus extending some of the benefits of the CDQ to non-CDQ area villages.

The EDA regional training facilities project for St. Marys' and the area is still pending final funding approval. However, because of the work performed so far in organizing this endeavor, EDA has awarded \$1,400,000 and USDA/Rural Development is holding a matching \$1,400,000 for the purchase of the St. Marys' Conference Center from the Catholic Church for regional training purposes. The State Division of Investments is providing a \$1,000,000 loan at 2% and HUD recently awarded \$50,000 to Ciunerkiurvik Corp., the non-profit formed for the purchase of the Conference Center. The \$50,000 is to be used to hire outside help to begin the operational setup of the training center.

LYEDC has developed a Lower Yukon Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy that includes the communities within YDFDA as well as five other area communities. Some projects identified in the CEDS may assist YDFDA in determining a course of fisheries and non-fisheries related development in the region.

- ◆ The Skiff and Sled Building Project was in full production this quarter in Alakanuk. This is the first facility of its kind on the Yukon. Four Yukon Delta residents have been involved in this program. This quarter they built two additional skiffs and one freight sled. Alterations and repairs were made for approximately 15 residents preparing for the salmon season. The welders also traveled to Kotlik and St. Michael to help local fishermen prepare their skiffs and gear for the Norton Sound herring and crab fisheries.

Skiffs are being advertised for sale in all communities of the lower Yukon as part of our outreach program. Loans can be financed through the Division of Investments or AVCP. YDFDA will guarantee up to 40% of loans made through the Division of Investments for YDFDA built skiffs and YDFDA built skiff/motor packages. Loan applications have been sent to the village representatives for potential applicants.

Objective:

- ◆ Fund community and individual projects that provide development opportunities in the lower Yukon
- ◆ Teach salmon quality preservation techniques to fishermen assuring higher quality fish with higher prices.

## **B. OUTREACH**

In May our training and employment coordinator met with junior and senior high school students in Emmonak to explain the various opportunities available through the CDQ program

We have continued our village representative program in our six villages, Alakanuk, Emmonak, Grayling, Kotlik, Mountain Village and Nunam Iqua. The village representatives work in the community to provide information regarding employment opportunities and training positions and administer drug tests to applicants. They also have applications and information on the scholarship programs and loan applications from both the Division of Investments and the AVCP Revolving Loan Program.

YDFDA's newsletter, the "Yukon Drifter", is being published quarterly. It is mailed to every household in member communities.

The training and employment coordinator is located at our Emmonak office. His duties include finding and filling inshore/offshore training and employment opportunities as well as training and educational opportunities at AVTEC, Alaska Pacific University, Sheldon Jackson College, all branches of the University of Alaska, and other learning institutes that meet the qualifications of our Scholarship program. This person administers YDFDA's scholarship programs and YDFDA's permit and gear loan programs through the Division of Investments and the AVCP Revolving Loan Programs. YDFDA feels it is important to administer these programs from the villages so residents have easy access to the programs they are most interested in.

We are providing the community of Marshall, a non-CDQ member village, ice machine and salmon totes under our Salmon Quality Preservation Project using EDA Disaster Funding.

Additionally YDFDA continues to work with other communities of the Yukon who are not members of CDQ communities by our continuing financial support of the Lower Yukon Economic Development Corporation (ARDOR).

YDFDA worked with State and Federal Agencies and the Calista Corporation to host a Funding and Jobs Summit at St. Marys in April. This summit included four non-CDQ villages. At the Summit, each participating community was asked to submit their top priority project for funding by various agencies.

The attached announcements were posted in the villages during the second quarter.
