**TRAINING PROGRAM 4: Internships**

One resident completed an advanced internship during this quarter at Icicle Seafoods' Seward office. One resident began an advanced internship during this quarter at Peter Pan Seafoods' Seattle office.

**TRAINING PROGRAM 5: Fishing and Seamanship**

One resident was aboard Golden Alaska's catcher vessel the F/V Ocean Leader fishing for Pollock during this quarter continuing a training internship. Two residents were aboard the F/V Lisa Marie fishing for halibut and sablefish this quarter. One was returning crew and one was a first time trainee.

***Initiative 2. Comprehensive Job Placement of YDFDA Community Residents***

Goal: Place 75 residents in offshore fisheries

Place 3 residents on catcher vessels after completion of internship

Place 4 residents on the F/V Lisa Marie

Place 7 residents in jobs utilizing vocational training

Milestone:

- ◆ 7 Yukon Delta residents were employed by Kwikpak Fisheries LLC. 5 were returning employees, 2 were new employees.
- ◆ 2 Yukon Delta residents participated in exploratory crab, both were first time crew.
- ◆ 3 Yukon Delta residents participated in exploratory halibut fishing. All three were first time employees.
- ◆ 16 Yukon Delta residents were aboard the M/V Golden Alaska for Pollock. 11 were returning crew, 5 were first time trainees.
- ◆ 1 Yukon Delta resident continued his internship on Golden Alaska catcher the F/V Ocean Leader vessel.
- ◆ 1 Yukon Delta resident was aboard the M/V Starbound as a galley assistant this quarter. She is a returning employee.
- ◆ 2 residents were aboard the F/V Lisa Marie fishing for halibut and sable fish. One was a returning crewmember and one was a first time trainee.
- ◆ \$197.55 was expended for crewmember training wages fishing aboard the F/V Lisa Marie.
- ◆ No funds were expended for the crewmember training aboard the Golden Alaska catcher vessel this quarter. Wages earned in the third quarter will be paid in the fourth quarter.

Objective:

- ◆ Provide employment opportunities for residents that would not otherwise be available

***Kwikpak Fisheries LLC***

Kwikpak Fisheries LLC, a subsidiary of YDFI, employed seven Yukon Delta residents. Two were returning employees and five were new employees.

***Golden Alaska Seafoods, Inc.***

Sixteen residents were aboard the M/V Golden Alaska for Pollock out of Dutch Harbor this quarter. Five were first time trainees, eleven were returning crew.

***Golden Alaska Catcher Vessels***

One resident was aboard the Golden Alaska catcher vessel F/V Ocean Leader this quarter continuing an internship program.

***Starbound***

One resident was aboard the M/V Starbound for Pollock out of Dutch Harbor. She was working as a galley assistant. She is a returning employee.

### ***Lisa Marie***

Two residents were aboard the F/V Lisa Marie this quarter as trainees fishing for sable fish and halibut. One was returning crew, one was a first time trainee.

### ***Halibut and Crab Test Fisheries***

YDFDA conducted a Norton Sound crab test fishery with two Yukon Delta residents aboard the F/V Kuzilvak. Both were new crew. YDFDA conducted a halibut test fishery off of the mouth of the Yukon River with three Yukon Delta residents participating. All three were new crew.

### ***Initiative 3. Permit Buy-Back, Fishing Vessels/Outboards Loan Guarantees and IFQ Share Purchase Program***

Goal: Enable residents to purchase major equipment and/or permits needed to complete in the local fisheries.

Provide additional royalty income to YDFDA, increased fishing time and profits to vessel and increased employment to residents.

Milestone:

- ◆ The State of Alaska declared the Yukon River salmon season a disaster for 2002. The market value of permits has dropped drastically reflecting extremely low ex-vessel herring and salmon prices. YDFDA has determined that pricing for permits has bottomed out. At this time YDFDA is working with the Division of Investments to obtain permits for our residents. YDFDA is expanding our loan guarantee program and has retained a private broker to assist in securing these low cost permits.
- ◆ In June of 2002 there was a small commercial fishery for king salmon. As a result, we have seen an increased interest by residents to purchase salmon permits. The fall chum season was anticipated to open in mid-August. However, due to poor returns an emergency was declared and there was no fishing.
- ◆ YDFDA continues to work with the Division of Investments to execute modification agreements to refinance and delay payments for several loans in arrears due to the disastrous fishing. Several applications are being prepared to purchase permits under this program.
- ◆ IFQ purchases – YDFDA received approval for a substantial amendment to purchase IFQ shares during the third quarter. We are pursuing the purchase of additional IFQ shares for fisheries appropriate to the F/V Lisa Marie and Yukon Delta's other investment goals.

Objectives:

- ◆ Make available up to \$100,000 in loan guarantees for permits and vessels/outboard motors.
- ◆ Provide additional royalty income to YDFDA
- ◆ Provide increased fishing time and profits to vessels and employment to residents.

***Initiative 4. Financial Support for Local Small Boat Multi-Fisheries***

Goal: Provide financial support for vessel or gear modifications to participate in Norton Sound fisheries.

Milestone:

- ◆ We have continued our program of providing vessel upgrades to fishermen participating in the Norton Sound herring season. We provided two reels and shakers to local fishermen bringing the total to six sets. This amounts to 20% of the 31 fishermen on the Yukon with Norton Sound herring permits. Our goal is to make this equipment available to 100% of the herring fleet enabling them to be more efficient and thus more competitive in this fishery.
- ◆ YDFDA conducted a Norton Sound crab test fishery with two Yukon Delta residents aboard the F/V Kuzilvak.
- ◆ YDFDA conducted a halibut test fishery off of the mouth of the Yukon River with three Yukon Delta residents participating.

Objective:

- ◆ Provide financial assistance to support private and company vessels to enable them to fish for Norton Sound herring, crab, salmon, halibut and other species.

***Initiative 5. Development of Shoreside Processing Operations***

Goal: Kotlik Yupik Corporation to begin operations as fresh fish fly out facility. However, the State of Alaska closed commercial fishing for the entire area in 2001.

Provide grant funds to assist the private sector fleet with exploratory research for commercial fisheries in proximity to the Yukon Delta

Complete planning and feasibility phase of Nunam Iqua Saltery

Yukon River Salmon Buying Operation (Kwikpak Fisheries LLC)

Milestone:

- ◆ Kwikpak Fisheries LLC completed sales of all product purchased in the Chinook fishery.
- ◆ Kwikpak Fisheries LLC geared up for a possible fall chum fishery. Unfortunately, the fishery was declared a disaster again in 2002 and no fishing occurred. YDFDA employed seven residents in preparation for this fishery.
- ◆ Kwikpak Fisheries LLC met with the Yukon Delta Fish Marketing Co-Op to discuss the feasibility of leasing the YDFM Co-Op barge for the 2003 season. We are currently awaiting a response from the YDFM Co-Op.
- ◆ YDFDA held a special board meeting in Kotlik in August to discuss the feasibility of in-region projects Kotlik is considering developing.
- ◆ YDFDA has presented a proposal to purchase or lease the Emmonak Value Added Plant. YDFDA is awaiting the Emmonak Tribal Council's counter proposal.
- ◆ Under the new disaster declaration, YDFDA is considering applying for additional EDA disaster funds to provide ice machines and support as part of a continued salmon quality preservation project for villages who did not participate in the original project.

Objective:

- ◆ Development of local community value-added operations
- ◆ Explore for commercial quantities of fish to be harvested by local residents.

***Initiative 6. Joint Venture Investments in Offshore Catcher/Processor Vessels***

Goal: Invest in joint ventures to purchase and jointly operate catcher and catcher/processor vessels in both open access and CDQ fisheries.

Create additional jobs and long-term employment opportunities

Milestone:

- ◆ YDFDA conducted preliminary due diligence discussions for investments in additional Pacific Cod and Crab vessel. Analysis of this project continues.
- ◆ YDFDA has met with other Golden Alaska owners to discuss expansion of our investment in the Golden Alaska mothership group.
- ◆ Provided Yukon Delta residents with fishing positions aboard the F/V Lisa Marie and Golden Alaska catcher vessels fishing both CDQ and open access.

Objective:

- ◆ To own and operate YDFDA's own fleet of vessels to prosecute the fisheries in the North Pacific.
- ◆ Establish a fleet of combination catcher and catcher/processor vessels to fish open access as well as CDQ fisheries in the Bering Sea.
- ◆ Maximize the employment and payroll benefits derived by local fishermen from open access and CDQ harvests.
- ◆ Protect YDFDA's equity.

***Initiative 7. Financial Support of Community Economic Development of Small Business Fisheries Infrastructure***

Goal: To develop local marine service facilities and fisheries business infrastructure to support the fishing industry.

Milestone:

- ◆ The Skiff Building and Repair Project continued operation this quarter in Alakanuk. This is the first facility of its kind in the Yukon Delta region. Five Yukon Delta residents were employed this quarter. This quarter they performed miscellaneous repairs for Yukon Delta residents.

Four skiffs were sold this quarter bringing the total sold for the year to five. Several sales are pending to Yukon Delta residents. CVRF through, its loan program, purchased a Yukon Delta skiff for one of its residents.

Skiffs are being advertised for sale in all communities of the lower Yukon as part of our outreach program. Loans can be financed through the Division of Investments or AVCP. YDFDA will guarantee up to 40% of loans made through the Division of Investments for YDFDA built skiffs and YDFDA built skiff/motor packages. Loan applications have been sent to the village representatives for potential applicants.

Objective:

- ◆ Fund community and individual projects that provide development opportunities in the lower Yukon
- ◆ Teach salmon quality preservation techniques to fishermen assuring higher quality fish with higher prices.

## **B. OUTREACH**

We have expanded our scholarship program to include non-CDQ villages in the region. This includes non-CDQ villages on the Yukon River between Grayling and Mt. Village, which are included in the Lower Yukon and Iditarod School Districts.

YDFDA is searching for a web site developer to design our website. A website would provide additional access to Yukon Delta residents seeking information about our programs.

Our village representative program continues in all six villages, Alakanuk, Emmonak, Grayling, Kotlik, Mountain Village and Nunam Iqua. The village representatives work in the community to provide information regarding employment opportunities and training positions and administer drug tests to applicants. They also have applications and information on the scholarship programs and loan applications from both the Division of Investments and the AVCP Revolving Loan Program.

YDFDA's newsletter, the "Yukon Drifter", is mailed to every household in member communities.

The training and employment coordinator is located at our Emmonak office. His duties include finding and filling inshore/offshore training and employment opportunities as well as training and educational opportunities at AVTEC, Alaska Pacific University, Sheldon Jackson College, all branches of the University of Alaska, and other learning institutes that meet the qualifications of our Scholarship program. This person administers YDFDA's scholarship programs and YDFDA's permit and gear loan programs through the Division of Investments and the AVCP Revolving Loan Programs. YDFDA feels it is important to administer these programs from the villages so residents have easy access to the programs they are most interested in.

Discussions continue with the community of Marshall to coordinate the production and marketing of Lower Yukon River salmon.

We have provided the community of Marshall, a non-CDQ member village, ice machine and salmon totes under our Salmon Quality Preservation Project using EDA Disaster Funding.

The attached announcements were posted in the villages during the third quarter.

During August and September the vessel also fished CDQ and IFQ Halibut in several different statistical fishing areas

#### **C/P Baranof**

The C/P Baranof fished IFQ during the month of July, August it fished CDQ and open access Pacific Cod and open access cod during the month of September

#### **F/V Kuzilvak**

The F/V Kuzilvak fished open access Norton Sound Red King Crab during July until the season closed during the following month. During this time it conducted halibut test fishing in various locations in Norton Sound and the Northern Bering Sea. During the latter part of August it also conducted a test fishery for Red King Crab using YDFDA CDQ crab as its resource.

#### **Other Pacific-Cod Harvesting Partners**

.Fished CDQ in early August and open access Pacific Cod for the remainder of the quarter.
