### A. PROGRESS TOWARD GOALS, OBJECTIVES, MILESTONES

#### *Initiative 1. Comprehensive Vocational and Educational Training Program*

Goals: Vocational Training

Provide 15 residents with vocational training annually

Provide 1 training class to Board of Directors

Scholarship Programs

Provide 12 residents with scholarships

Internship and Apprenticeship Program

Place 6 trainees on vessels

Place 5 in internship or apprenticeship programs

Milestone:

- ◆ Fishing and Seamanship
  - 1 resident as a trainee aboard catcher vessels
  - 3 residents as trainees aboard F/V Lisa Marie (1 started last quarter)
- ◆ 9 Yukon Delta residents continued classes at AVTEC this quarter
- ◆ 17 college student were enrolled and received YDFDA scholarships during this quarter
  - 10 students were enrolled at the University of Alaska
  - 3 students were enrolled at APU (1 graduated this quarter)

- ◆ Provide on the job training to qualified residents to enable them to work into higher paying jobs on vessels and in administrative positions

**TRAINING PROGRAM 1: Business and Office Technology**

Five students continued the Business and Office Technology course at AVTEC this quarter.

**TRAINING PROGRAM 2: Facilities Maintenance**

Three students continued the Facilities Maintenance course at AVTEC this quarter.

**TRAINING PROGRAM 3: Culinary Arts**

One resident continued the Culinary Arts course at AVTEC this quarter.

**TRAINING PROGRAM 4: Internships**

Four residents worked at internships during this quarter. One was at Peter Pan Seafoods in Seattle, one was at Icicle Seafoods' Bellingham plant and two were at Icicle Seafoods' Seattle office. The intern at Icicle Seafoods' Bellingham plant successfully completed her internship this quarter.

**TRAINING PROGRAM 5: Fishing and Seamanship**

One resident was aboard Golden Alaska's catcher vessel the F/V Ocean Leader fishing for Pollock during this quarter continuing a training internship. Three residents were aboard the F/V Lisa Marie fishing for halibut and king crab during this quarter as trainees.

***Initiative 2. Comprehensive Job Placement of YDFDA Community Residents***

Goal: Place 75 residents in offshore fisheries

Place 3 residents on catcher vessels after completion of internship

Place 4 residents on the F/V Lisa Marie

Place 7 residents in jobs utilizing vocational training

Milestone:

- ◆ Because most fishing and processing jobs carried over from the third quarter to the fourth, there were no Yukon Delta residents employed as first time trainees during this quarter
- ◆ 1 Yukon Delta resident continued his internship on a Golden Alaska catcher vessel
- ◆ \$21,520 was expended for three crewmember's training wages fishing aboard the F/V Lisa Marie.
- ◆ \$18,642 was expended for the crewmembers training aboard the Golden Alaska catcher vessels. This figure includes wages earned in previous quarters, but not previously recorded.

Objective:

- ◆ Provide employment opportunities for residents that would not otherwise be available

***Golden Alaska Seafoods, Inc.***

Eleven residents were aboard the M/V Golden Alaska for Pollock CD Season in the 4th quarter. All eleven started in the third quarter; six were first time trainees, five were returning crew.

***Golden Alaska Catcher Vessels***

One resident was aboard the Golden Alaska catcher vessel F/V Ocean Leader this quarter continuing an internship program.

***Lisa Marie***

Three residents were aboard the F/V Lisa Marie this quarter fishing halibut and King Crab. All three were trainees continuing from the third quarter.

***Icicle Seafoods***

One resident was employed by Icicle Seafoods during this quarter. He was returning crew aboard the Bering Star in Dutch Harbor processing cod.

***American Seafoods***

Two residents were employed by American Seafoods during this quarter. One was aboard the Triumph and one was aboard the Dynasty processing Pollock out of Dutch Harbor. Both were returning crew continuing from the third quarter.

***Aleutian Spray Fisheries***

Seven residents were aboard the F/V Starbound in the 4th quarter processing Pollock out of Dutch Harbor. All seven started in the third quarter. Four were first time trainees, three were returning crew.

***Initiative 3. Permit Buy-Back, Fishing Vessels/Outboards Loan Guarantees and IFQ Share Purchase Program***

Goal: Enable residents to purchase major equipment and/or permits needed to complete in the local fisheries.

Provide additional royalty income to YDFDA, increased fishing time and profits to vessel and increased employment to residents.

Milestone:

- ◆ The State of Alaska declared the Yukon River salmon season a disaster for 2000 and a further declaration encompassed the current year, 2001. For this reason, YDFDA is not actively promoting or encouraging new salmon or herring permit loan applications. The Yukon River remained closed to commercial fishing for the 2001 season. The market value of permits has dropped drastically reflecting extremely low ex-vessel herring and salmon prices. It is not feasible at this time to invest further in the local fisheries.
- ◆ YDFDA continues to work with the Division of Investments to execute modification agreements to refinance and delay payments for several loans in arrears due to the disastrous fishing.
- ◆ IFQ purchases – YDFDA is investigating the purchase of additional IFQ shares for fisheries appropriate to the F/V Lisa Marie and Yukon Delta's other investment goals.

Objectives:

- ◆ Make available up to \$100,000 in loan guarantees for permits and vessels/outboard motors.
- ◆ Provide additional royalty income to YDFDA
- ◆ Provide increased fishing time and profits to vessels and employment to residents.

***Initiative 4. Financial Support for Local Small Boat Multi-Fisheries***

Goal: Provide financial support for vessel or gear modifications to participate in Norton Sound fisheries.

Milestone:

- ◆ We have begun seeking markets for the 2002 Norton Sound herring season.

Objective:

- ◆ Provide financial assistance to support private and company vessels to enable them to fish for Norton Sound herring, crab, salmon, halibut and other species.

***Initiative 5. Development of Shoreside Processing Operations***

Goal: Kotlik Yupik Corporation to begin operations as fresh fish fly out facility. However, the State of Alaska closed commercial fishing for the entire area in 2001.

Provide grant funds to assist the private sector fleet with exploratory research for commercial fisheries in proximity to the Yukon Delta

Complete planning and feasibility phase of Nunam Iqua Saltery

Milestone:

- ◆ YDFDA continued funding the planning grant for Kotlik Yupik Corporation. YDFDA attended numerous meetings with Kotlik to discuss the feasibility of in region projects Kotlik is considering developing.
- ◆ Kotlik Yupik Corporation is working on preparation of a gravel pad for the ice machine and generator being provided by YDFDA with EDA disaster funding. It is anticipated that the gravel pad will be installed in early summer 2002.
- ◆ Nunam Iqua Saltery – This project remains on hold due to the recent closure of the commercial salmon fishery and projected closure in that district for the foreseeable future.
- ◆ YDFDA met with the Emmonak Tribal Council to discuss the feasibility of in region projects Emmonak is considering developing.
- ◆ YDFDA's Board of Directors received a presentation from the fisheries consultant who visited the Emmonak Value Added Plant. YDFDA is in ongoing discussions with the Emmonak Tribal Council to lease or purchase the Emmonak Value Added Plant.
- ◆ YDFDA has received final approval for EDA disaster funds to provide ice machines and support as part of a salmon quality preservation project in Marshall, Mountain Village and Kotlik and provide insulated totes and shipping liners to Emmonak and other villages. This project is being supported with Economic Development Administration Disaster Funding. Two hundred insulated fish totes were shipped in May. The ice machines have been purchased, one has been delivered to Kotlik and the others are being prepared for shipment in the spring.

Objective:

- ◆ Development of local community value-added operations
- ◆ Explore for commercial quantities of fish to be harvested by local residents.

***Initiative 6. Joint Venture Investments in Offshore Catcher/Processor Vessels***

Goal: Invest in joint ventures to purchase and jointly operate catcher and catcher/processor vessels in both open access and CDQ fisheries.

Create additional jobs and long-term employment opportunities

Milestone:

- ◆ YDFDA is actively pursuing an investment in a crab vessel. Analysis of this project continues.
- ◆ YDFDA is actively pursuing an investment in a longline catcher/processor. Analysis of this project continues with several potential partners.
- ◆ YDFDA is involved in ongoing discussions to expand our investment in the Golden Alaska mothership group.
- ◆ Provided Yukon Delta residents with fishing positions aboard the F/V Lisa Marie and Golden Alaska catcher vessels fishing both CDQ and open access.

Objective:

- ◆ To own and operate YDFDA's own fleet of vessels to prosecute the fisheries in the North Pacific.
- ◆ Establish a fleet of combination catcher and catcher/processor vessels to fish open access as well as CDQ fisheries in the Bering Sea.
- ◆ Maximize the employment and payroll benefits derived by local fishermen from open access and CDQ harvests.
- ◆ Protect YDFDA's equity.

***Initiative 7. Financial Support of Community Economic Development of Small Business Fisheries Infrastructure***

Goal: To develop local marine service facilities and fisheries business infrastructure to support the fishing industry.

Milestone:

- ◆ YDFDA's Board of Directors heard a presentation from LYEDC at their December Meeting. The Board voted not to provide local matching funds to LYEDC.

- ◆ The Skiff Building and Repair Project continued operation this quarter in Alakanuk. This is the first facility of its kind in the Yukon Delta region. Four Yukon Delta residents were employed this quarter. This quarter they completed two skiffs.

One skiff was sold during this quarter with several sales pending.

Skiffs are being advertised for sale in all communities of the lower Yukon as part of our outreach program. Loans can be financed through the Division of Investments or AVCP. YDFDA will guarantee up to 40% of loans made through the Division of Investments for YDFDA built skiffs and YDFDA built skiff/motor packages. Loan applications have been sent to the village representatives for potential applicants.

Objective:

- ◆ Fund community and individual projects that provide development opportunities in the lower Yukon
- ◆ Teach salmon quality preservation techniques to fishermen assuring higher quality fish with higher prices.

## **B. OUTREACH**

**At our December Board of Directors Meeting, the Board voted to expand our scholarship program to include non-CDQ villages in the region. This would include non-CDQ villages on the Yukon River between Grayling and Mt. Village which are included in the Lower Yukon and Iditarod School Districts.**

We have continued our village representative program in our six villages, Alakanuk, Emmonak, Grayling, Kotlik, Mountain Village and Nunam Iqua. The village representatives work in the community to provide information regarding employment opportunities and training positions and administer drug tests to applicants. They also have applications and information on the scholarship programs and loan applications from both the Division of Investments and the AVCP Revolving Loan Program.

In December the village representatives met with the training and employment coordinator in Emmonak for an orientation on the various services they offer.

Two issues of YDFDA's newsletter, the "Yukon Drifter", were published this quarter. It is mailed to every household in member communities.

The training and employment coordinator is located at our Emmonak office. His duties include finding and filling inshore/offshore training and employment opportunities as well as training and educational opportunities at AVTEC, Alaska Pacific University, Sheldon Jackson College, all branches of the University of Alaska, and other learning institutes that meet the qualifications of our Scholarship program. This person administers YDFDA's scholarship programs and YDFDA's permit and gear loan programs through the Division of Investments and the AVCP Revolving Loan Programs. YDFDA feels it is important to administer these programs from the villages so residents have easy access to the programs they are most interested in.

We are in discussions with the community of Marshall to coordinate the production and marketing of Lower Yukon River salmon.

We are providing the community of Marshall, a non-CDQ member village, ice machine and salmon totes under our Salmon Quality Preservation Project using EDA Disaster Funding.

The attached announcements were posted in the villages during the third quarter.

### **C. Compliance**

There were no compliance issues during the fourth quarter in any fishery of which we were aware.

### **D. Other Fishing Issues/Activities**

#### **M/V Golden Alaska , F/V American Beauty and F/V Ocean Leader**

These vessels harvested and processed the balance of C/D season Pollock leaving approximately 40 tons un-harvested for the year. Due to high by-catch of salmon the vessels were required to finish their fishing outside the salmon savings area.

#### **F/V Lisa Marie**

The F/V Lisa Marie fished both open access and YDFDA CDQ King Crab and the transferred balance of BBEDC CDQ King Crab. They also fished YDFDA IFQ as well as the remaining balance of YDFDA CDQ halibut and a portion of CDQ Halibut for NSEDC and APICDA. The weather was terribly inclement

#### **32-Foot Vessel**

YDFI owns one 32-foot bow picker. This vessel is currently in storage, dry-docked in Nome.

#### **Harvesting Partner P-Cod C/P's**

YDFDA had nine vessels authorized to finish harvesting CDQ P-cod during the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter, but for numerous reasons only one vessel participated in harvested CDQ P-cod. Problems encountered included extreme weather conditions, the length of the open access season remaining open until December 10<sup>th</sup> and they could not keep enough crew together to continue fishing, another vessel had a crack in its hull and stopped fishing, return to port to get ready and do maintenance and repair for the 2002 season. High by-catch rates of other species earlier in the year prevented more P-cod from being harvested at that time. Therefore, YDFDA left approximately 29% of its CDQ P-cod un-harvested. Although 29% was un-harvested, royalty guarantees were still paid on one-third of the un-harvested catch. We are already making arrangements for 2002 to see to it that this does not happen again. The changes in regulations concerning the non-specific reserve being effective January 1, 2002 will allow us to make accurately allocate any Other Species reserves right from the beginning of 2002

#### **Bristol Bay Red King Red Crab.**

Yukon Delta harvested 110,886 lbs of 111,172 lbs of the CDQ allocation with the F/V Lisa Marie. 286 lbs were left un-harvested.
