APPRENTICE APPLICATION FOR BODY PIERCING OR TATTOOING AND PERMANENT COSMETIC COLORING

The Board of Barbers and Hairdressers will issue a student permit for the purposes of receiving training from a licensed practitioner of tattooing and permanent cosmetic coloring or body piercing.

To receive training, you must:

- ◆ complete the attached application;
- ◆ submit the \$25.00 permit fee;
- ◆ submit a copy of the Certificate of Sanitary Standard issued to the shop in which the training will take place;
- ◆ be 18 years of age when the training commences;
- ◆ have completed a CPR course and a blood borne pathogens course
- ◆ receive training in a licensed shop in this state under a person who has a practitioner's license in this state in the field in which the trainee seeks training.

Included in this packet is:

- ◆ the required application that you must complete and return;
- ◆ a Statement of Responsibility form that the practitioner who is providing training must complete and return with this application;
- ◆ the curriculum requirement for both professions. Complete the appropriate curriculum form and return it with this application.

Please note that you must have valid proof of completing a CPR course and a blood borne pathogens course before you can begin your apprenticeship. When returning the application, you must also submit

1. A certified true copy of a current CPR card; and
2. A certified true copy of a current blood borne pathogens card.

Upon receipt of a properly completed application, fees and required documentation, your application will be reviewed and if approved, a student permit will be issued and mailed to you. You may begin training upon receipt of the student permit. The training must be completed in not more than 12 months from the date of its commencement.

After training has been completed, both student and trainer will need to provide proof of training on a form provided by the board.

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BODY PIERCING CURRICULUM

12 AAC 09.167 requires a body piercing student to receive at **least 1,000 hours of theoretical and practical training**. The training must be completed within one year from the date of commencement and include:

- ◆ A minimum of 270 hours of theory instruction
- ◆ A minimum of 150 hours of practical operations broken out by
 - (50 practical operations observed by the student)
 - (50 practical operations in which the student participated)
 - (50 practical operations performed by the student under supervision, but without assistance)

The 270 hours of theory must include the following:

Subject	<u>Minimum</u> Number of Theory Hours for Body Piercing Curriculum
(1) Safety, sanitation, sterilization, and aseptic.	100
(2) Anatomy and physiology	30
(3) Skin and skin disorders	10
(4) Aftercare techniques	100
(5) Equipment and supplies	20
(6) Alaska Statutes and Regulations	10

In addition to the training mentioned above, a student must receive training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and blood borne pathogens. (Students will not be scheduled for the state examination without proof of a current CPR card and blood borne pathogens course.)

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TATTOOING AND PERMANENT COSMETIC COLORING TRAINING

12 AAC 09.169 requires a tattooing and permanent cosmetic coloring student to receive at **least 380 hours of theoretical and practical training.** The training must be completed within one year from the date of commencement and include:

- ◆ a minimum of 130 hours of theory instruction
- ◆ a minimum of 150 hours of practical operations.

The 130 hours of theory must include the following:

Subject	Minimum Number of Theory Hours for Tattooing and Permanent Cosmetic Coloring Curriculum
(1) Safety, sanitation, sterilization, and aseptic	50
(2) Anatomy and physiology	30
(3) Skin and skin disorders	10
(4) Aftercare techniques	10
(5) Equipment and supplies	20
(6) Alaska Statutes and Regulations	10

In addition to the training mentioned above, a student must receive training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and blood borne pathogens. (Students will not be scheduled for the state examination without proof of a current CPR card and blood borne pathogens course.)
